


Theme E: Improving Accessibility	It's a shame the railway line was Beeching'd. Just imagine what a difference that link to the rail station in Fareham would have made. I can't think that more roads or widening roads will make much difference, as they just fill up with more traffic as soon as they are open. The E1 and E2 are excellent services but other routes were cancelled some time ago. Public transport seems to be the best way to help our access problems
