1.0 INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 The Gosport Borough Local Plan 2011-2029 (GBLP) was adopted by the Council on 14th October 2015. The new development promoted by the GBLP will require a various types of infrastructure to support it. The Council has prepared this Infrastructure Delivery Plan which sets out identified scheme details, lead providers, costings and timescales (where these are known).
- 1.2 The IDP is divided into a number of key infrastructure headings covering a number infrastructure items including: transport, education, community facilities and open space. The document represents a snap shot at a particular point in time and will be updated as schemes are completed and new schemes come along.
