You might have heard in the news that the energy price cap is set to increase by 54% in April - but what does this really mean for your fuel bills?

The price cap refers to the amount energy companies can charge per unit of fuel you use; it does not mean there is a certain total amount you cannot be charged over. This means it's more important than ever to use energy efficiently, as you'll be charged much more for the energy you use. For the average household, this price cap increase will mean bills rise by up to £700 more a year.

Households on a standard variable tariff, which is what you will be on if you haven't joined a contracted fixed term tariff, will be subject to the price cap increases. At the minute energy companies can't offer a competitive fixed tariff, so switching suppliers or signing up for a fixed tariff won't work out cheaper - the advice at the moment is to stay on the standard tariff, even with the increased price cap.

Don't panic! There is support available if you're struggling to pay your fuel bills. You can access a wide range of advice and schemes through Switched On Gosport!"

The recent news of the sharp rise in the energy price cap is causing anxiety for many people. However there is help available.

Through our partners in Portsmouth City Council, Switched On Gosport is able to offer a free energy and money saving advice service. If you meet any of a broad range of income, health or vulnerability criteria, you can apply for a home visit from an expert advisor.

They will provide you with tailored advice, such as helping identify simple measures you can take to reduce your bills, helping find funding for larger energy saving improvements, checking that you're on the most suitable tariff for your needs, or giving more general advice on managing your budget. They can also answer any specific questions you might have.

Demand for this service is currently very high at the moment, so the earlier you apply, the earlier a visit can be arranged. You can find out more by visiting **switchedongosport. co.uk** and clicking on "**Get FREE help with your energy bills**".



The Greening Campaign The Greening Campaign is up and running in local communities around Gosport, helping them work together to become more sustainable.

All members of the community of all ages can get involved, with support including information packs and expert advice guiding communities through a structured process.

If you live in Leesland, Elson, Hardway, Alverstoke or Lee-on-Solent, you can join in with the Greening Campaigns already active in those areas. Greening Leesland has now completed phase 1 of the campaign, during which over 100 people committed to actions that will collectively save 37 tonnes of CO2 per year.


The group is now looking for more residents to join as it moves into phase 2, which will focus on rewilding. Greening Alverstoke recently held a successful launch event for its campaign and would welcome volunteers to help complete phase 1 of the campaign.

There are also opportunities to join steering groups shaping the campaigns in the other areas.

If you live elsewhere, Gosport Borough Council is still looking for more communities of between 250 and 8000 households, who want to take up the challenge and see what changes they can make to become greener. If you are involved in any local community groups that might like to run a Greening Campaign, the Council can provide funding to get you started, and the Greening Campaign will then support you to get everyone in your community engaged.



YOUR RECYCLING BIN Please include:



Please remember everything placed in your recycling bin should be clean, dry and loose:

- Make sure all food residue and attachments (e.g. sellotape) are removed from your recycling.
- Please ensure your recycling is dry when placing it in your recycling bin.
- Do not place your recycling in any sort of plastic bag, it should be loose in your bin.







If you've ever tried to complete complicated benefit claim forms or had to provide financial or legal information, you'll know it's a minefield.

For an older person it can be almost impossible. How do you know what benefits you are entitled to and how do you go about claiming them?

For many older people, that additional income can mean not having to worry about turning up the heating in cold weather. It can mean having more money to spend on food and other essentials. And that's where Age Concern Gosport's free form-filling support comes in.

In the last year, Age Concern Gosport's volunteers have helped over 100 clients with their claims.

With 91% of the claims being successful, this has resulted in £318,808 per annum in benefits being paid to those people in need, right here in Gosport.

What Claim Forms can we help with?

The most common claims we help with are:

- ▶ Attendance Allowance
- Personal Independence Payments (PIP)
- ▶ Pension Credits
- Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
- Disabled parking 'Blue Badge' applications

Trained Volunteers

Age Concern Gosport's team of volunteers are trained to help, each having completed Making Every Contact Count training (MECC). Each claim and request for help is completed in absolute confidence, so you don't have to worry about discussing your private affairs with your Age Concern Gosport volunteer.

The Council will permit closures where:

- ▶ The street is a lightly trafficked minor residential road, and not normally used by through traffic
- No access will be required to adjacent shops, businesses and services during the event
- ▶ There is a suitable alternative route for vehicles to use without the need for traffic diversions
- ▶ The closure will not create traffic issues elsewhere, and
- It will not inconvenience other people

Licensing Team

If you are planning on having your party in a public street you should first contact the Council to confirm that the street is suitable. Contact the Licensing Team by emailing or calling:

A cul de sac or short crescent is likely to be ideal for street parties. In this type of road you will not have to consult people beyond your own street, and you won't need a traffic management plan or traffic diversions.

Please note that you will be responsible for providing (and funding) any signage or barriers as the Council is not able to provide them for you.

We need to be aware of these street parties so that we can give our colleagues in the emergency services and Highways adequate notice of any event that is going to be taking place and also so that we can advise you on any other licences or permissions that may be required.

How to apply for a street party:

- Should you decide to go ahead and organise a Street Party, please fill in the Street Party application form, and submit it to: licensingofficers@fareham.gov.uk
- This should be done at least 6 weeks before the event is due to take place (last date for submissions will be Friday 22 April)

Top tips to keep your family healthy and happy



1 Sugar swaps

Swap fizzy drinks, juice drinks and flavoured milks for water, lower-fat milks and no added sugar drinks.

3 Snack smart

Sugary snacks can all add up! When choosing packaged snacks, stick to two a day max. But remember, fruit and vegetables are always the best snack.

Get going every day

Kids need 60 active minutes each day. This can be in short 10 minute bursts throughout the day, try scootering to school, skipping to the shops, or dancing to a song. Keep track of screen time – many parents find it helpful to set a daily limit.
