Humidity assaults my skin As I click-clack outside To see, the graceful dancing Of two flitting butterflies


The heavy hum of lawnmowers drowns out the noisy street; Excited kids chase ice-cream vans race, with bare, dirty feet

Barbecue safety

Follow the safety instructions provided with disposable barbecues.

- Never use a barbecue indoors or in a tent.
- ▶ Keep a bucket of water, sand, or a garden hose nearby for emergencies.
- Never leave a lit barbecue unattended.
- Make sure your barbecue is well away from sheds, fences, trees, shrubs, or garden waste.
- In the countryside or public park areas, only use disposable barbecues where there are specially designated areas and carefully follow the safety guidance.
- Use enough charcoal to cover the base of the barbecue, but not more (normally around 5cm or 2 inches).
- ▶ Keep children, pets and garden games away from the cooking area.
- After cooking, make sure the barbecue is cool before moving it.
- Empty ashes onto bare garden soil, not into dustbins or wheelie bins. If they're hot, they can melt the plastic and cause a fire.
- Enjoy yourself, but don't drink too much alcohol if you are in charge of the barbecue. Never use petrol or paraffin to start or revive your barbecue; use only recognised lighters or starter fuels on cold coals.

Gas barbecues

- Never store gas cylinders under the stairs if there is a fire they might explode and block your escape route.
- Store gas cylinders outside, away from direct sunlight and frost.
- Make sure the tap is turned off before changing the gas cylinder.
- After cooking, turn the gas supply off first and then the barbecue control. This will stop any gas from leaking.
- If you suspect a leak, turn off the gas cylinder and try brushing soapy water around all joints, watching for bubbles.
- Make sure all joints are tightened, safe and secure.
- Change gas cylinders outdoors or in a wellventilated area.

Did you know?

- A fire can destroy a tent in less than 60 seconds.
- On average 27,000 fires are started on grass, heathland and moorland every year, an average of 73 fires everyday!
- 50,000 fires occur in refuse and rubbish containers each year.

Reminder for communal areas

Gosport Borough council do not permit BBQ's or the use of paddling pools on communal land and balconies.





The use of CCTV is governed by the Data Protection Act 1998 (DPA) and is regulated by the Information Commissioner. The ICO recommends that CCTV is used in a responsible way to protect the privacy of others.

The guiding principle of using CCTV should be checking that its use is necessary and proportionate.

Consider why you want to use CCTV and whether this will provide the best solution.

It is really vital that you ask yourself some important questions before you install CCTV.

Do you really need a camera to address your concerns?

Check advice issued by your local police about crime prevention. Better locks or security lighting may be a more effective and less expensive way of securing your property.

What areas will your CCTV cover?

If you decide to use CCTV you need to consider which areas will be covered and what is the most privacy friendly way to set up your CCTV.

If the camera only covers property within your boundaries then you would fall under a Domestic Purpose Exemption and would not be governed by the DPA and ICO. You will need to seek permission from the council to make a home improvement to install the CCTV.

However, if your camera covers areas beyond the boundaries of your property, including neighbouring gardens, pavements and the road, then you do not fall under the Domestic Purposes Exemption. This does not mean that you are breaching the Data Protection Act but it does mean that you will need to take some steps to comply with it. This includes:

- ▶ Paying a fee to register with the ICO as a data controller operating CCTV. You will then be put onto a public register as a data controller for the CCTV and must comply with all of associated requirements of the regulations.
- ▶ Putting adequate signage up to state recording is taking place (permission is needed from the council for this).

Other things to consider before installing CCTV cameras

- You must ensure all recordings are stored securely and only the data controller (yourself) has access to this.
- The impact your CCTV has on your neighbours. Consider speaking to your neighbours and explain what you are doing and take into account any objections or suggestions they have.
- Purchasing equipment that enables you to control what areas you record will allow you to keep privacy intrusion to a minimum.
- If your camera covers any areas beyond the boundaries of your property, individuals have the right to request a copy of any footage they may be seen in from you and you are obliged to provide this to them.

▶ Audio recording facilities must be disabled.

If the council identifies any use of CCTV that may be in breach of the Data Protection Act, we have a duty to report it to the regulator for investigation. If any neighbours object to you installing CCTV we will be advising them to speak directly to the ICO for further guidance.

Permission to install CCTV will be withheld by the council until we are satisfied that you have met the conditions of the ICO.

Please register with the ICO and follow the guidance highlighted above, ensuring you provide the council with proof of these actions otherwise you will need to take the camera down completely.

Switched on Gosport


The recent sharp rise in gas and electricity prices is causing concern for many people. However there is help available.

They can also answer any specific questions you might have. Demand for this service is very high, so the earlier you apply, the earlier a visit can be arranged.

Greening Campaign



Make a difference

The Greening Campaign is up and running in local communities around Gosport, helping them work together to become more sustainable. Members of the community of all ages can get involved, with support including information packs and expert advice guiding communities through a structured process.

Greening Lee-on-Solent will be holding an event in July to launch phase 1 of their campaign; look out for details from the Lee Residents Association and Lee Hub to find out more. Following the campaign they will be delivering challenge cards across Lee-On-Solent, so everyone can take part in the campaign.

Greening Leesland and Greening Alverstoke have now completed phase 1 of the campaign, with nearly 300 households committing to actions that will collectively save over 140 tonnes of CO₂ per year. These groups are now looking for more residents to join as they move into phase 2, which will help communities take action together, focusing on rewilding, retrofitting homes and preparing for the health impacts of climate change.

If you live elsewhere, Gosport Borough council is still looking for more communities of between 250 and 8000 households. who want to take up the challenge and see what changes they can make to become greener. If you are involved in any local community groups that might like to run a Greening Campaign, the council can provide funding to get you started, and the Greening Campaign will then support you to get everyone in your community engaged.

Rubbish and recycling collection 2021/22



Fly-tipping

Householders beware. When arranging private waste removal, it's your responsibility to ask collectors to produce a 'waste carriers licence', and to give you a 'waste transfer note' for items collected. You should also obtain a receipt for money given. Fly tipped waste traced to you could result in your prosecution.

The council is responsible for the clearing of fly tips on adopted highways and council owned land. If the fly tipping has occurred on private land, the landlord or tenant is responsible for removing the illegally dumped waste.

Often fly tipping/dumping of rubbish occurs on private land that does not fall to the responsibility of the Local Authority to clear.

Many rear passageways are private property and are the shared responsibility of all residents who benefit from the access. Consequently the duty to maintain them falls to the residents. If you have household rubbish to dispose of that cannot be put out with your regular collection, this can be taken to the local Household Waste Recycling Centre free of charge. Alternatively, the council offers a Bulky Household Waste Collections service, or you could employ a private contractor to collect your waste and dispose of this safely.

Gosport Borough council has a zero tolerance policy towards fly tipping and will consider prosecuting all cases of fly tipping within the Borough boundary.

Gosport Borough Council Sheltered Housing

What is sheltered housing?

Sheltered housing enables older people to live independently in flats or bungalows within a supportive environment designed to suit their needs. In Gosport these groups of flats or bungalows are called schemes. Although each scheme is different, all have a communal lounge for informal and organised social activities and 24-hour emergency assistance from locally based staff called Older Persons Support Officer (OPSO).

Sheltered housing is not residential care or a nursing home. Residents remain completely responsible for running their own household, paying bills and managing their own affairs.

Generally residents should be over 60 and meet the eligibility requirements to apply for a tenancy at one of our schemes.

Older Persons Support Officer (OPSO)

What your OPSO will do for you:

- Give advice on a wide range of services, benefits and advice on how to access services locally
- Provide a 24-hour response to emergency calls
- Give advice and information on applying for state benefits, based on individual need
- Carry out regular health and safety checks and fire alarm tests schemes
- ▶ Report and monitor repairs to the communal areas, and in residents flats, if requested
- Encourage social activities that include the wider community
- Develop and promote partnerships with other agencies.

- Laundry room
- Guest room
- Door entry system
- Emergency alarm system
- Social activities
- Visiting hairdressers and chiropodists.



Being connected to the Gosport **Borough Council Community Alarm** Service enables our customers to summon help quickly and easily 24 hours a day all year round, simply by pressing a button.

Using up-to-date technology and equipment the service helps people to maintain independent living and gives families and friends the reassurance that help is just an alarm call away.

How does it work?

The alarm service operates over the telephone network via a special 'Lifeline' alarm unit.

A small alarm button is worn as a pendant or on the wrist so that in the case of an emergency the alarm button can be pressed to call for help.

This automatically alerts trained operators at PPP Taking Care and they are able to speak to you over a loudspeaker on the alarm unit.

When the call is received staff will see your details on their computer screen. Once they have established with you what the problem is they can send the appropriate help.

This could be a neighbour, a friend, a relative, Gosport Borough council responders or the emergency services. which includes installation and hire of the equipment and prices include VAT.

You may be eligible for VAT exemption on Option 1 and partial VAT exemption on Option 2 if you are chronically sick or disabled. Please ask us for an exemption form.

Option 1

£4.09 per week

(£3.41 with VAT exemption)

24 hour alarm monitoring.

Option 2

£10.68 per week

(£10.00 with partial VAT exemption)

24 hour alarm monitoring and 24 hour emergency response from our staff if required.
