DOMESTIC ABUSE

This programme is for men aged 18+ who want to change their abusive behaviour towards a partner and addresses physical, sexual, trust and emotional respect and the affects domestic abuse has on children. Once an initial 2-hour face-to-face assessment has been completed we will complete pre-group sessions, while you await a start date for the programme. The aim of this work is to provide an increased understanding of unhealthy behaviours and we will introduce repeatable tools to help implement change, which can be used as coping strategies for negative emotions. Our groups are run in Basingstoke. Eastleigh, Havant, IOW and Southampton from 18.15-20.15pm on a weekly basis.

EMPLOYMENT

At a time when young people face even more challenge and competition in the labour market from older and more experienced workers, a traineeship can be the step up that they need to launch their career and enter the labour market. It is desirable for trainees to have a minimum grade of 3-9 or A-D GCSE in English and/or Maths, or a Functional Skills at Level 1 or above. However, if an individual does not meet this entry requirement the application needs to come with a supporting statement, which demonstrates motivation and determination to achieve these during the programme.
