HOUSING OPTIONS

What choices do you have?

- Stay in your home but adapt your property or the support you receive to make life easier
- Purchase another house, flat or bungalow, using the money from the sale of your present home
- Release funds from your current home (if you are a home owner)
- Move in with family or friends
- Rent a retirement property
- Move into a residential or nursing home if you need care and support

DO I HAVE TO MOVE HOME?

There are a few things to consider which may help you to decide whether or not moving is the right choice for you. With a few adaptions to your home or the right support in place, you may not need to move.

If you decide that your current home is unsuitable for your needs and that you cannot adapt it sufficiently to meet your requirements, you may wish to consider moving home.

Your current housing situation and other needs may influence the choices available to you.

Renting your home:

If you are a Gosport Borough Council Tenant or Registered Social Housing Tenant:

Talk to your landlord about your options, this may include applying for a transfer to more suitable accommodation.

Depending on your tenancy, you may be able to exchange (swap your home) with another tenant through the 'HomeSwapper Scheme'.

Sheltered Housing in Gosport

The following is a list of sheltered or retirement housing in the Gosport area.

Sheltered or retirement housing is often independent living with support if needed. As well as a self-contained unit within a scheme, most have shared facilities and these might include a communal lounge, gardens, laundry, guest facilities and access to a lift. There is usually an age criteria to be eligible for a home within a scheme and you should check with the individual landlord. If you have a pet and would like it to remain with you when you move, then check with the landlord as not all will allow pets.

If you are:

- renting from another landlord
- living with family or friends
- own a mobile home
- homeless

Seek advice from Gosport Borough Council's Housing Options service or contact Citizens Advice Bureau.

Own your own home or have a mortgage:

If you are a homeowner and have a property to sell, consider getting it valued as a first step. Knowing the value of your home is important and may help you decide whether you are planning to rent or buy a property. Any good estate agent will provide a valuation free of charge even if you are not ready to place your property on the market.

If you own your home but want to move to a rented flat or bungalow, do not sell until you have found a new home to live in.

CAN I STAY IN MY OWN HOME?

Help is available to enable older people to remain independent without the need to move home.

Disabled adaptions to my home

Disabled adaptions can be equipment or alterations to your home that enable you to have easier access around your home and garden. Depending on your needs, this might include grab rails, equipment to help you get in the bath, stair lifts or alterations to some rooms or major improvements.

An Occupational Therapist will assess your needs and make a recommendation about what improvements are necessary and they will liaise with relevant organisations.

Your current housing and financial situation will determine how you can access funds for adaptations to your home. If you are renting your home, speak to your landlord. If you own your own home speak to your OccupationalTherapist about the options available to you.

Support to help you stay in your home

If you want to stay in your current home but may need a little extra help, there are a range of services available to you such as:

- help to maintain your home
- providing meals
- help with shopping and housework
- personal care
- providing social contact

There are also support agencies that can provide regular welfare visits as well as offering a community or pendant alarm service. A community or pendant alarm is a telephone based alarm system giving help, support and security.

If you are considering renting a sheltered or retirement property find out about what's available in your area by checking the Elderly Accommodation Counsel (EAC) website or contacting Gosport Borough Council.

If you are thinking of buying a retirement property this information may be available on the EAC website, as well as contacting local estate agents.

At the end of this booklet you will find a list of sheltered or retirement housing in the Gosport area.

Extra Care Housing

Extra care housing enables customers to live independently in their own property with the reassurance of on-site care and support facilities. Spinnaker View and Juniper Court extra care schemes in Gosport have a range of one and two bedroom flats with the benefit of communal lounges and restaurants as well as a team on of on-site carers. To be eligible you must have a housing and care need. Please call **023 9254 5254** for more information.

Buying a home

If you are buying a home there are several things to think about. As well as the usual consideration of property type, size, price and location - consider long term issues which might affect the type of housing you will need. This could include access to amenities, such as shops or a GP surgery; any disabled adaptations you need now or in the future; proximity to support from family, friends or carers; and whether or not the property is near to public transport.

Residential or Nursing Care Homes

Residential care homes (with or without nursing) are suitable for people who require specialist care. Help may be available to pay for residential or nursing care and this should be checked before accepting a placement. Help in finding the right care home is available from health and social care professionals, dependent upon individual circumstances.

Equity Release

Equity release is a way of raising money against the value of your home. It is vital to take independent financial advice before signing up to a scheme, to make sure you consider all the possibilities and implications.

Equity release is where you borrow money against the value of your home but you pay nothing back until your home is sold – either after your death or if you go into a care home.

Equity Release is a big decision and might not be the best or only option for you. Think of other ways to raise money such as moving to a smaller property or checking all the benefits you are entitled to.

RENT OR BUY – what are my options?

Social Housing

The Council manage the 'Gosport Choice Housing Register' which is a list of people who wish to rent a home in Gosport from either the Council or a partner Housing Association. Your housing and other needs will be considered and you will be allocated points.

Properties available to rent are advertised on a weekly basis and applicants must express an interest, known as 'bidding'. Applicants with the highest priority will be offered the property. This service is free.

Private Renting

You can find information about properties available to rent from a private landlord using local newspapers, websites, and estate or lettings agents. As well as rent, there are other costs to consider including a deposit, management or administration fee, and sometimes service charges. You should check these costs before signing a tenancy agreement, as well finding out who is responsible for repairs and maintenance.

Private rented accommodation is usually let on an assured shorthold tenancy for a minimum period of six months. Make sure you speak to your landlord or letting agent about the length of tenancy and ask about periodic charges to renew a tenancy agreement. If you require adaptations to a property then make sure these can be done before signing a tenancy agreement.

Sheltered or Retirement Housing

There are different types of sheltered or retirement housing but they are specially designed for people aged over 60. Typically, this type of housing provides a 24-hour emergency response service (pendant and/or pull cord alarm), and staff to assist. Staff are not always based at schemes - check this with the housing provider.

Sheltered or retirement housing is independent living but with the assurance of having a home which is easier to manage, added security and someone to help in an emergency. Accommodation is usually self-contained and schemes generally have communal
