


Cheques can be sent in the post or through the secure letterbox at the front of the Town Hall.

Asbestos

Due to the age of the council's housing stock, it's likely some asbestos will be present. The council has carried out asbestos surveys in a large proportion of properties and overall risk was found to be low.

If you are a council resident you should seek permission before making any alterations to your home. You must also make the council aware immediately, if you suspect asbestos to be damaged.

Contact the council if you:

- Are planning any alterations to your home
- Want any advice regarding asbestos
- Are reporting any damage to suspected asbestos

Don't disturb anything you think may have asbestos in it (disturbing it means things like drilling, sawing, scrubbing or sanding). We might already have an asbestos survey for your home.

Common locations where there may be asbestos in your home:

- Decorative texture coatings (artex) to ceilings and walls
- Vinyl or thermoplastic products (such as floor tiles or underlay)
- Wall panelling and boxing (such as lining in meter cupboards or service risers)
- Soffit boards (asbestos cement products)
- Corrugated sheets (such as garage or shed roofs)

Although there may be other areas in your home you can find asbestos, generally, asbestos is usually safe in your home unless it is damaged or disturbed.

Reporting Repairs

You can report non-urgent repairs by calling **Kier** on their free-phone number, available 24 hours a day.

Any emergency repairs, including boilers, can also be reported on the free-phone number.



New advice service on housing issues



Local people can now get advice on housing problems 24 hours a day, thanks to a new online advice hub.



The Advice Aid service has been set up by Gosport Borough Council to help people get the information they need at a time that suits them.

It covers topics such as homelessness, benefits, harassment, eviction, domestic abuse, rent or mortgage arrears, housing rights and debt.

The Leader of the Council, Cllr Peter Chegwyn/Cllr Sue Ballard, who chairs the council's Housing Board, said:

"Sadly, we're finding an increasing demand for advice on housing issues. This service is a way people can get information tailored to them, whenever they need it.

"It's always important to know your rights and responsibilities when it comes to housing, as issues can arise at any time. Whether you're threatened with eviction from your landlord, or going through a relationship breakdown, getting the right advice at the right time is vital."

For those residents who don't have a mobile number, email address or prefer only to receive letters, the GOV.UK notify will not be used.

Barbecue safety

- Keep a bucket of water, sand, or a garden hose nearby for emergencies
- Follow the safety instructions provided
- Never use a barbecue indoors or in a tent
- Never leave a lit barbecue unattended
- Make sure your barbecue is well away from sheds, fences, trees, shrubs, garden waste, children, pets or garden games
- In public areas only use disposable barbecues where there are specially designated areas
- Use enough charcoal to cover the base of the barbecue but not more
- Empty ashes onto bare garden soil; not into dustbins or wheelie bins
- Never use petrol or paraffin to start or revive your barbecue; use only recognised lighters or starters on cold coals

Preventing mould

Mould can cause serious health issues if it is not addressed. Luckily, there are lots of simple techniques to prevent black mould from spreading in the home. Have a look at the top tips for keeping a mould-free home:

- Open curtains and blinds during the day
- Make sure window vents are left permanently open
- Wipe down moisture on windows to prevent mould growth
- Open windows to let fresh air inside, even during wet weather
- Close all doors when cooking or bathing
- Use extractor fans and open windows when cooking and bathing
- Place lids on pots and pans when cooking
- Heat your home to a constant minimum of 19-20°C
- Wipe down shower screen, tiles and mirror after use
- Dehumidifiers reduce moisture in the air
- Where possible, dry clothes outside
- Do not put damp clothes on radiators

Further to the Government's Charter for Social Housing Residents: Social Housing White Paper (2020), The Regulator of Social Housing (RSH) has consulted on proposals for Tenant Satisfaction Measures (TSMs). The TSMs are designed to provide data about landlords' performance and the quality of their services. TSMs are intended to help tenants evaluate how their landlord is performing and where they need to improve.

Registered Provider landlords, including local councils, will have to demonstrate to the Regulator that the voices of their tenants are being heard and acted on. The proposed TSMs both include information measures such as health and safety compliance and tenant perception measures, to be collected through landlords' surveys.

The survey will be live from 14 July 2023.



Fire safety in communal areas

Following recent fires in our properties, we would like to highlight the importance of keeping all communal areas clear. This is essential to provide the safest exit possible in case of a fire.



Our housing staff, and the community fire safety officer, have been visiting the blocks, to identify what actions can be taken, to allow for the safest exit route possible. The most helpful action is for residents to keep areas clear and to report any issues, as soon as they are spotted.

To help keep you and your community safe, please do not leave items in shared walkways, stairways and gardens.

Items can be bicycles, white goods, buggies, planters, door mats, toys, refuse bags and sometimes furniture – no items are permitted to be left in communal areas.

We understand that storage can be limited, but your safety is our main priority. As your landlord we have an obligation to ensure everyone can leave their property safely in an emergency situation.

The photos shown here are recently taken from communal areas around the borough. It really highlights the extreme nature of this issue and your cooperation is very much appreciated.
