Chill and Charge were picked as winners because of their "involvement with the Kickstart program, offering an opportunity to a young job seeker with no office experience. Subsequently, they were considerate around her and other employees childcare needs, supporting and progressing their careers



whilst offering flexible working." Langdale Nursing Home were commended for supporting and up-skilling staff gaining QCCF levels 2-5 and becoming a 'Real Living Wage' employer in 2023. Also commended were Wickham Micro Ltd for their apprenticeship program with HSDC including winning Apprentice of The Year Jordan Richards - making history as first apprentice to receive a promotion while still completing his studies.

Best Use of Heritage in Business: **Powder Monkey Brewery**

Judges said of the winners, Powder Monkey Brewery: "Heritage is the DNA of this business as demonstrated by its name, branding - both for the company and its beers - and choice of buildings for its Gosport base. Two nationally important buildings, one Grade II* and one Grade II have been repurposed into a brewery, visitor centre and tap house to become significant additions to the heritage destination offer at Priddy's Hard. "The ethos of the company's brand and the names of its beers proudly celebrate the

naval history of Priddy's Hard and Gosport and are an innovative way of promoting both, particularly to new audiences."

Also commended were Lightship Restaurant and Portsmouth Historic Quarter (Adventure Prospect).



Independent Retail Business of the Year: **The Book Shop, Lee-on-the-Solent**

Winners, The Book Shop, took the prize according to judges, because: "They are a historic landmark in Lee-on-the-Solent and a business which creates community and reminds people of the importance of reading and community spirit. 

A site brimming with history – and looking towards a bright future

Daedalus Waterfront is a 17 hectare former naval barracks in the heart of Lee-on-the-Solent. For nearly 70 years HMS Daedalus was a source of extraordinary pride, energy and innovation. This prominent military base played a crucial role in the Second World Wardmost notably as the busiest airfield on D-Day. Throughout its active life, HMS Daedalus was home and workplace to thousands, the engine of an entire community and a point of pride for the nation.
