PART II

39. BUS SERVICES – CROSS REFERENCE FROM THE OVERVIEW AND SCRUINY COMMITTEE

Consideration was given to a cross reference from the Overview and Scrutiny Committee, the Report of the Bus Services Working Group.

The Vice Chairman advised that he had had been involved with bus services in his role as a County Councillor and as Ward Councillor for Lee East and that he met with the Managing Director of First Bus.

He recognised that the Report was well written and that it was easy to read.

The Board were advised that the main issues with buses surrounded services number 9, 11 and 21. The number 9 had been amended slightly through Grange and Rowner but the suggestion to redirect through Bridgemary had not been taken up.

It had been requested that the number 21 continues to provide a service to allow the residents of Lee on the Solent to access Fareham via Newgate Lane and that a number 11 Saturday service continue to serve the residents of Bridgemary and Clayhall.

The Vice Chairman advised that he had attended the Environment Select Committee meeting of Hampshire County Council and been advised that subsidy funding of £4,500 for the number 11 Saturday service and £5,500 for the 21 service covering Lee-on-the-Solent would be cut.

It was proposed at the meeting and the Committee had agreed that the funding for these services should not be cut, but the Executive Member for Transport had decided against this.

The Vice-Chairman advised that he had approached the Leader of Gosport Borough Council to see whether the Council could support the retention of the cut bus services in any way.

Although subsidy funding of £5,500 to the 21 service had been cut, resulting in the service no longer covering Lee-on-the-Solent, it was subsequently advised that to reinstate the Lee-on-the-Solent element of the service a subsidy of £19,000 would be required. This was as a result of the route being amended so that the reintroduction of the route to include Lee-on-the-Solent

would now require an additional bus, leading to an increase in the subsidy required.

In answer to a Member's question, the Board were advised that First Bus were required to run services as a commercial operation at a profit and that unsustainable routes could not operate. This was why subsidy had been required to operate certain routes. It was acknowledged that the Working Group had worked hard to ensure that they had maximum influence over the routes, but that the Council had no direct decision making powers regarding bus services.

It was recognised that the Vice-Chairman and County Councillor Cully had worked hard at a County level to protect services, but that a subsidy of £19,000 was beyond the capability of Gosport Borough Council to support. It was felt however that it could be possible to provide a subsidy to support the retention of the number 11 Saturday service.

Members acknowledged the importance of services to residents. It was acknowledged that previously services had been under used but had been able to be retained ensuring that vital services remained in place to get passengers to work.

Concern was expressed that the views of the Transport Select Committee had been ignored and that services to residents in Fareham had been preserved and rerouted to shorten journey time, whilst the residents of Lee-on-the-Solent had been subjected to large levels of cuts in service in previous years.

Members supported the retention of the Saturday number 11 services as it was the only service that travelled directly along Fareham Road. Concern was expressed that a report detailing the reinstatement of the number 11 Saturday service had been in the local newspaper before consideration had been given to it by the Council.

It was also requested that following the release of central government funding figures, and in response to Gosport Borough Council's grant being cut by 6% and the County Council's grant being increased by 2.4% that the County Council reconsider their decision to cut the subsidy to the service.

Members were advised that should a decision be made at this meeting that Gosport Borough Council could support the reintroduction of the number 11 Saturday service, the service could be reinstated between 4 and 8 weeks. Any delay would mean that it may then take longer to reinstate.

Members acknowledged that the County Council had supported bus services in the Borough by investing millions of pounds in the Eclipse service, which was an excellent service but expressed concern that this was at the expense of other services that the elderly and disabled relied on. They also accepted that bus routes had to make a profit.

A Member expressed concern that changes to routes were occurring every 6 months and that confusion surrounding bus timetables led to a reduction in use of services. Concern was also expressed that a large number of late night services had been cut, reducing the services available to passengers using bus services to commute to and from work, forcing people to use cars to travel. It was felt that the changing of timetables led to a reduction in passenger confidence in services, which subsequently led to a reduction in use.

Members agreed that they did not want any proposal to support the reinstatement of the number 11 Saturday service to be viewed that Gosport Borough Council had ability to support all services cut by the County Council.

Members reiterated the success of the Eclipse service, but felt that the success should not be at the expense of other services.

Members recognised that cuts had been made to bring the concessionary fare service in line with the national scheme as free concessionary travel was no longer available between 09.00 and 09.29 on weekdays and the importance of the concessionary scheme to its users.

It was proposed and seconded that Gosport Borough Council subsidise the number 11 Saturday service. It was proposed that the service be supported for two years to allow for continuity and allow customers to use and benefit from a consistent service.

Members welcomed the support it would provide to residents, including those in Juniper Court, Fareham Road and Tukes Avenue, who could not walk the distance to the Eclipse, it was felt this would provide a lifeline to residents on a Saturday, Members recognised the importance of the service to the prosperity of the whole Borough.

It was requested that a letter be written to the County Council requesting that consideration be given to reinstating their subsidy of the service in light of the recent central government funding announcement.

RESOLVED: That:

- The Policy and Organisation Board note the report of the Bus Services Working Group and thank Councillors and Officers for the work undertaken; and
- It be agreed to subsidise the Route 11 Saturday Service up to £4, 500 per annum for two years to ensure continuity of service on a Saturday.

40. STAFFING REVIEW

Consideration was given to a report of the Chief executive recommending the creation of the new post of Technical Officer within the Streetscene section of the Chief Executive's Unit.

In answer to a Member's question, the Board were advised that position would be advertised on a County wide job portal and that the interviews would most likely be undertaken by the Head of Streetscene.

RESOLVED: That the creation of a new post, Technical Officer Grade 6, (subject to Job Evaluation) be approved with immediate effect.

Purpose

To advise the Council of the responses to consultation on the Review of the Parliamentary Constituency Polling Districts and Polling Places and to agree changes as set out in this report.

Recommendation

- 1. To approve the Polling Districts and Polling Places set out in the Schedule to this report
- 2. To agree to fund the cost (up to a maximum of £3000) of improvements to disabled access to the Music Room at Thorngate Hall as set out in paragraph 2.11 of this report.

1 Background

- 1.1 The Council is required by Section 18 of the Representation of the People Act 1983 to carry out reviews of Polling Districts and Polling Places for the Parliamentary Constituency. This current review has to be completed by 31 January 2015. The review will not consider the boundary of the Parliamentary Constituency. The arrangements put in place following the review will be used for Local Government elections.
- 1.2 Overview and Scrutiny Committee prepared draft proposals for consultation and have also considered the one response from the Returning Officer. A copy of their report is attached as Appendix 5.

2 Report

- 2.1 A Polling District is the area created by the division of a constituency into smaller parts within which a polling place can be determined which is convenient to electors.
- 2.2 A Polling Place is the building or area in which Polling Stations will be selected by the Returning Officer
- 2.3 A Polling Station is the room or building where the poll takes place. It

is chosen by the Returning Officer for the election and publicised on the Notice of Poll and communicated to electors on the Poll Card

Procedure for Review

- 2.4 The Council has to give notice that it is conducting a review in accordance with the relevant regulations including seeking responses from the electorate, bodies or persons with expertise in access for persons with disabilities on their proposals. This notice was given on 30 June 2014. At their meeting on 10 September 2014, Overview and Scrutiny Committee considered all the representations made in response to the notice of review and made changes in the light of some of them and also the Returning Officers response to the notice of review. The draft proposals for consultation were published on 22 September 2014 and representations had to be made by 31 October 2014.
- 2.5 The Returning Officer has to be consulted and must respond to the consultation on draft proposals with details of existing polling stations and polling stations that would probably be used based on any newly recommended Polling Place. The Returning Officer's response has to be published within 30 days of receipt by the Council. The Returning Officer's response is included in Appendix 6.
- 2.6 Once the Council has considered the response to its consultation the final proposals have to be published and the Register of Electors amended to reflect the review.
- 2.7 In order to take account of future requirements proposed areas of new residential development and projected population changes may need to be considered. However, I have been advised that these are not materially different.
- 2.8 The Returning Officer has checked the records from Polling Station Inspectors and reports from other polling station staff about the condition of polling stations and accessibility of the currently used polling stations and has commented on the proposals.
- 2.9 When undertaking the review of Polling Districts the Council must seek to ensure that all electors in the constituency in its area have such reasonable facilities for voting as are practicable in the circumstances.
- 2.10 When reviewing polling places the Council must:
 - seek to ensure that all electors in a constituency in its area have such reasonable facilities for voting as are practicable in the circumstances;
 - seek to ensure that so far as is reasonable and practicable every polling place for which it is responsible is accessible to electors who are disabled;

- have regard to the accessibility to disabled persons of potential polling stations in any place which it is considering designating as a polling place or the designation of which as a polling place it is reviewing;
- unless special circumstances make it desirable to designate an area wholly or partly outside the polling district designate polling places in the polling district; and
- ensure the polling place for a polling district is small enough to indicate to electors in different parts of the district how they will be able to reach the polling station.

If no polling place is designated for a polling district then the polling district is to be taken to be the polling place.

Polling Districts

- 2.11 In response to representations made by the Ward Councillors for Privett and the Returning Officers representations dated 21 August and 31 October 2014 (Appendix 6), the changes below are proposed to the following polling districts only:
 - Alverstoke- No. 1 Stokes Bay Road is currently in polling district GA1 for which the polling place is Gomer Infant School. As can be seen from Appendix 1 the adjacent properties are within polling district GA3 for which the polling place is Alverstoke Infant School which is closer to the property than Gomer Infant School. Therefore it is proposed that No.1 Stokes Bay Road is removed from GA1 and included in GA3.
 - **Privett-** The Ward Councillors for Privett Ward responded, to the notice of review, that the polling place for Polling District GO1 which is St Mary's RC Primary School Norman Road is not in a satisfactory location for the residents of the Cheriton estate and suggested that the Gosport Cricket Club site within Privett Park should be investigated. The Returning officer commented on this representation in her letter dated 21 August 2014 (Appendix 6) and the Overview and Scrutiny Committee on 10 September accepted that Thorngate Halls would be suitable as the polling place for GO1provided level disabled access to the Music Room is provided. There is a pay and display car park at Thorngate Halls with the first 20 minutes free of charge. Disabled parking bays are available. Thorngate Halls is a well known venue and is on several bus routes and subject to the improvement of access for persons with disabilities so that temporary ramps do not have to be used would be a suitable alternative. Whilst it is outside the ward the existing polling place is also outside the ward and there are no suitable venues within the ward. If the polling place for GO1 is changed then the changes to GO2 and GO3 set out in the Returning Officers letter would be beneficial for

all electors in those polling districts. Gosport Community Association are prepared to provide this level disabled access to the Music Room provided the Council contribute to all or part of the costs. Indicative costings suggest that the works should not exceed £3000. It is recommended that the Council pay for the whole or contribute towards the costs of these works up to a maximum of £3000. The proposed changes to the polling districts are shown in Appendix 3. If the polling place for GO1 is changed then the changes to GO2 and GO3 set out in the Returning Officers letter would be beneficial for all electors in those polling districts. The proposed changes to the polling districts are shown in Appendix 3.

• Rowner and Holbrook- The Returning Officers proposal that the number of polling districts are reduced from 4 to 2 for Rowner and Holbrrok (GP) will regularise what has been happening for a number of years and will not affect any elector. The proposed changes are shown in Appendix 4.

Polling Places

- **Brockhurst** The Returning Officer has raised concern about the size of the polling place, Solent Evangelical Church to be able to cope efficiently with a higher turnout at a Parliamentary election given that all three polling districts use the same venue. Subject to the recommendation in respect of Privett (GO) Polling District being approved it would therefore be appropriate to move the polling place for GE3 back to St Mary's RC School, Norman Road, which was used until 2007. Whilst it is outside the ward there are no other suitable venues in the ward and the School has been used before for these electors. The proposed changes are shown In Appendix 2
 - Elson- One letter of representation (Appendix 7) was made in respect of polling places for Elson (GG.) For the reasons set out in the report to Overview and Scrutiny Committee on 10 September 2014 (Appendix 5) it is not proposed to make any changes to the polling places for Elson (GG).
- 2.13 The only other changes to polling places are those required as a result of the proposed changes to polling districts set out in 2.11.

3 Risk Assessment

3.1 The Council has to comply with its statutory obligation and conduct the review before the end of January 2015.

4 Conclusion

4.1 Changes to polling districts in 3 Wards and changes to the polling

places for one polling district in Brockhurst (GE3) and, if the recommendation in respect of Privett (GO) is agreed, to Privett are proposed and it is recommended that the Polling Districts and Polling Places set out in the Schedule are approved. These changes will be reflected in the electoral register which will be published on 2 March 2015.

REVIEW OF POLLING DISTRICTS AND POLLING PLACES

Thank you for your letter dated 30 June 2014 regarding the above.

As you will be aware I have already provided you with a list of current polling districts, polling places and a list of polling stations and arrangements for access.

Since the last review in 2011 I have not received any complaints about the location of polling stations nor provisions within the polling stations for people with disabilities.

Polling District GO- Privett Ward

I am aware of the responses from the Ward Councillors for Privett Ward and acknowledge that finding a suitable polling place for GO1 is not straightforward. As Returning Officer I have not received any complaints from electors in GO1 about the location of the polling place.

I have visited Gosport Cricket Club within Privett Park as suggested by the Ward Councillors and noted on my visit that there is limited access to the Pavilion, indeed there is a barrier which is kept closed and just a narrow opening for pedestrians. This opening would not be sufficient for people with mobility issues to access either on a mobility scooter or in a wheelchair. If the barrier, which prevents vehicular access was to be lifted for polling day this would create other potential problems with cars accessing and seeking to use the car parking places which are marked disabled by the side of the Pavilion. If these cars were not able to park they would then have to turn round in a very narrow area and potentially park on the access road, again impeding access for people with disabilities. I am concerned that the access route for the residents of GO1 is through the park, which is not lit at night. I am also concerned about the safety of polling station staff in this building within an unlit park. In these circumstances I would not be prepared to use the Gosport Cricket Club Pavilion as a polling station, and therefore cannot recommend to the Council that it becomes the polling place for GO1.

However, I do consider that there is another location which would appear to be more suitable than the current polling place. Thorngate Halls has been considered as part of the

2007 review and was discounted as access was difficult and they could not guarantee the availability of the venue at short notice. There have been significant changes to the venue recently and there are a number of smaller rooms which are available for hire, including the Music Room which would be suitable to be used as a polling station and is on the Bury Road frontage. Whilst the current access to the Music Room for people with disabilities is not suitable initial discussions with the Chairman of Gosport Community Trust has indicated that they would be prepared to work with the Council to provide level access. This would be on the basis that the Council funded the works. I have had initial discussions with the Council's Head of Conservation and Design who does not consider that such limited works would be a problem and the Head of Building Control has also confirmed that it is possible to get a compliant disabled access at this location. It is estimated that the costs of such works would be less than £3000.

Thorngate Halls is in Leesland Ward, as is the existing polling place for GO1 at St Mary's RC School at Norman Road, but there are no other suitable facilities within the polling district and it is considerably less distance to travel for a large proportion of electors. If the polling place was moved from Norman Road to Thorngate Halls 277 electors would have further to travel and 855 would be closer to Thorngate Halls than Norman Road.

I would also recommend that should the polling place for GO1 be changed to Thorngate Halls, that the following properties which are currently in GO2 are moved to GO1:- Admirals Walk; Canberra Close: North Close; Privett Road; The Chase; Woodward Close.

The electors in the above properties currently vote at Gomer Infant School as part of GO2 and they would be closer to Thorngate Halls than they are currently to Gomer Infant School.

Gomer Infants School currently is the polling place for three polling districts GO2 and GO3 from Privett Ward and GA1 of Alverstoke Ward. The School is only able to make available a small hall and it is not a particularly efficient venue for three polling stations, particularly covering two wards. There have on occasions been queues at this polling station particularly at Parliamentary Elections, and I have for a number of years appointed a Senior Presiding Officer and additional Poll Clerks to help with directing electors to the three polling stations. If GO1 was now to go to Thorngate Halls and part of GO2 was also to go to Thorngate Halls this would leave a total of 598 electors in GO2 and 1284 in GO3. On this basis it would be possible to combine GO2 and GO3 and to divide Privett Ward into two polling districts, GO1 with 1539 electors with a polling place of Thorngate Halls and GO2 with an electorate of 1882 with a polling place of Gomer Infant School. This would mean just two polling stations at the school which would improve the efficiency of the polling stations and make it easier for electors.

Polling District GG- Elson

I have also seen the letter from the local resident regarding alternative polling venues for Elson Ward, which is currently Elson Junior School for both GG1 and GG2. The reason for their request is that they feel that their child's education is being harmed, as although only two classrooms are used for polling purposes the whole school is closed on polling days. They consider that there may be other venues available and whilst this might incur additional costs these can be met from the funds provided to the Council for the organising of

elections and they consider that the cost of the loss of a day's schooling to the education of all of the children at Elson Junior School are more difficult to quantify but easily outweigh some additional hire charges.

In response I would advise that the grounds relating to disruption and loss of learning are points that could be made by every school. In Gosport there is significant reliance on the use of schools as polling stations and as Returning Officer I have been given the right to use publically funded schools as polling stations free of charge by Parliament. I have investigated whether the 2 alternatives suggested by the resident are suitable. I have contacted St. Thomas's Church Hall and it is not available. Using St Columba's United Reform Church, which is at the very edge of the ward, would entail a larger number of electors travelling further to that polling station than they do travelling to Elson Junior School and they have not replied to messages left with them so I am unable to confirm if it is available.

As Returning Officer I do not require the school to be closed on Election Day; this is a matter for the Head Teacher but as ever I am willing to work with the Head Teacher to see where two polling stations could be provided within the school building so that all or parts of the school could open.

I would recommend that there be no change to the polling place for polling districts GG1 and GG2.

Polling District GE- Brockhurst

I do wish to make a proposal in respect of Brockhurst Ward (Polling districts GE).

At present there are three polling districts, all of which have a polling place of Solent Evangelical Church. There is only one small hall within the church with steps at the front and disabled access at the rear. Currently only two polling stations operate at elections with one polling station for GE1 and 2. The total number of electorate for the polling place is 3,887. I do not consider that for a Parliamentary Election Solent Evangelical Church is large enough, having regard to the 2 access points, to accommodate three separate polling stations. Combining two polling districts into one polling station does lead to confusion for electors, which with the be significantly increased turnout for a Parliamentary election would affect the efficiency of the polling stations.

Therefore, I would propose that polling district GE3 revert to a polling place of St. Mary's Roman Catholic School, Norman Road, Gosport which was the polling place until the Polling Places Review in December 2007. Following that review the polling place for GE3 was Middlecroft Gosport Hall, Middlecroft Lane, however that ceased to be available as a polling place in 2013. Moving the polling place for GE3 back to St Mary's Roman Catholic School will mean that that location is nearer to some electors in polling district GE3 than Solent Evangelical Church and farther for some electors to reach. On balance it is not considered that the majority of electors in the polling district will be inconvenienced by the relocation of the polling place. This is the statutory criteria that must be taken into account when considering the location of polling places. The school also has level disabled access. The

school is however outside the polling district, it is in Leesland Ward, but there are no other suitable facilities within the polling district and it was used as a polling station for GE3 up to 2007.

Polling District GP- Rowner and Holbrook

Currently there are 4 polling districts 2 of which use the Rowner Junior School and the other 2 use Grange Junior School. I have for a number of years only provided 1 polling station at each polling place rather than one polling station for each polling district as the numbers in each polling district are small. I would recommend that the number of polling districts is reduced to 2 by combining GP1 and GP2; and combining GP3 and GP4. The 2 new polling districts of GP1 and GP2 would have an electorate of 1936 and 1551 respectively. The polling place would not change and the electors would not notice any difference in how or where they vote.

REVIEW OF POLLING DISTRICTS AND POLLING PLACES

Thank you for your letter dated 22 September 2014 regarding the above enclosing the Council's draft proposals.

I note that all the proposals set out in my letter dated 2 September 2014 have been included.


Since my previous letter we have continued to review the properties included within each polling districts and there are small number of anomalies which it would be useful to address in this review.

Polling District GA1 includes the property 1 Stokes Bay Road, which is the only property in Stokes Bay Road situated towards the eastern end of Stokes Bay Road geographically and is located in, and surrounded by, properties in Polling District GA3. I would therefore propose that this property should be reallocated to Polling District GA3. The residents of 1, Stokes Bay Road currently travel to Gomer Infant School to vote, should the property be reallocated to GA3, the residents will travel to Alverstoke Infant School, which is closer and would therefore significantly reduce the distance they need to travel to vote.

There are also a small number of properties that have/will be added to the register as new properties are brought into use. I will provide a full list of these new properties shortly before the final report is finalised.





Purpose

The purpose of this report is to inform Members of the proposal not to change the Local Council Tax Support scheme (LCTS) for Gosport for the forthcoming 2015-2016 financial year other than minor changes to reflect the changes to the Regulations by the Department of Work and Pensions.

Recommendations

That Council approve the Local Council Tax Support Scheme (LCTS) for Gosport at Appendix 1 of this report and notes the statutory scheme for Pension Age customers.

1 Background

- 1.1 On 23 January 2012 full Council approved the Local Council Tax Support Scheme for Gosport for the 2013/14 financial year. The unchanged scheme for 2014/15 was approved by full Council on the 18 December 2013.
- 1.2 Legislation requires that the scheme is approved by full Council for each year. Proposed changes to this year's scheme are minor and are in response to statutory changes required by law as the Council's scheme must include prescribed requirements as set out in Regulations.

2 Report

2.1 In December 2014 new Regulations were issued which amended the prescribed requirements for the LCTS. The proposed changes are being made to reflect the new prescribed requirements within the Regulations. The main area of change within the prescribed requirements, and therefore reflected in the proposed changes to the LCTS, relate to payments to Persons from Abroad, which now brings the LCTS in line with the Housing Benefit scheme, minor amendments and updating of definitions to be used and the correction of drafting errors.. As the proposed changes are to reflect changes the Council have to make to accord with Regulations no consultation is required.

The scheme at Appendix 1 maintains the following protections for

2.2 vulnerable Customers:

- The continuation of income disregards for Disability benefits, Child benefit and maintenance payments.
- The continuation of the full income disregard for War Widows and War disablement pension.
- The continuation of "extended payments" or benefit "runons" when a Customer starts work or increases their hours in work.
- "fast track" claims to expedite re-claims after a short period of temporary work reducing the requirement for extended verification.
- 2.3 The changes in the proposed scheme which are required to ensure the scheme accords with legislation will have a limited impact on Customers and maintains a prudent financial approach whilst continuing to protect and assist our most vulnerable Customers.

3 Financial implications

- 3.1 It is not anticipated that the proposed changes to the scheme will in themselves lead to a significant cost increase.
- 3.2 The Central Government Grant 2013/14 included a separately identified sum of £706,000 to fund this Council's costs arising from providing a Local Council Tax Support Scheme. From 2014/15 no separation of the sum included within the Central Government Grant has been made.

4 Risk Assessment

- 4.1 To mitigate any challenges to the Council over new LCTS scheme, an initial Equality Impact risk assessment was undertaken followed by a full Equalities Impact Assessment, which considered all factors of the scheme and the responses to the Consultation. This full Equality Impact Assessment has been considered by the Corporate Equalities and Diversity Steering Group and the proposed changes are merely to reflect changes in statute.
- 4.2 The Central Government Grant given to finance the scheme is no longer separately identified in 2015/16. In common with all Council grant funded expenditure there is a risk that Central Government Support will be further reduced resulting in greater difficulty in providing for the proposed scheme within the resources available.
