14. MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD 9 JUNE 2015

RESOLVED: That the minutes of the meeting of the Committee held on 9 June 2015 be approved and signed by the Chairman as a true and correct record.

15. REPORTS TO BE RECEIVED

i. Interpretation Boards

The Chairman invited Councillor Scard to provide an additional verbal update to that of Cllr Mrs Forder's written update for members. He shared that Kevin Casey had joined the working group and his knowledge and voluntary work had been helpful to the, group advising that Mr Casey was a volunteer at the Diving Museum and a member of the Friends of Stokes Bay Committee. Costings for the improvements, replacements or addition of interpretation boards had been provided by Mr Casey and Gosport Borough Council.

Councillor Scard advised there had been a suggestion of involving the men's 'Shed Scheme' and that he would be arranging a meeting with Mr Casey and a representative at the 'Shed'. He continued by saying that it would assist if the representative could be involved with the work on the design for future boards as they were currently of different materials and not all were weatherproof. He added that Mr Casey had suggested a design made of Perspex where information sheets could easily be updated. In response to a question Councillor Scard advised members that Tony Lawrence of the Lawrence family had agreed to provide photographs free of charge.

ii. Public Access to Fort Brockhurst

The Borough Solicitor provided a verbal update to the Committee. The Borough Solicitor advised members that contacting and arranging a meeting with English Heritage to look at the Draft Management Plan was still in progress. She added that background papers for this working group would be sent to new members of the Committee.

Clarity was provided in response to questions raised; in relation to the education facility at Fort Brockhurst it was confirmed that the facility was used by schools, The Council for Summer Passport and other agencies; that the bridge has been used by vehicles and further confirmed that English Heritage used some facilities for storage however it was believed this would not impact negatively on access for the public.

16. DEVELOPMENT OF A WORK PROGRAMME

A. Requests for Scrutiny

The Chairman called on members to raise requests for scrutiny.

Councillor Mrs Wright requested two areas to be considered:

i) the first being the strategic review of housing allocation and the void properties process within Housing Services Unit.

Members discussed the request. It was advised that recent changes to the allocation policy that had been agreed at Community Board may resolve void property issues. Members also discussed options and timing of the request for scrutiny. It was agreed that it was too early to scrutinise the allocation policy, and It was felt that it be more appropriate to allow time to see the outcome of the changes made.

RESOLVED: That Stuart Palmer, Interim Housing Services Manager, provided a presentation to Members at the December meeting and that scrutiny be programmed for post-Christmas.

ii) the second area suggested for scrutiny was for the investigation of council spending relating to the use of Agency staff and Consultants.

Members discussed the difficulty in recruiting specialist staff to fill posts and that this resulted in utilising agency staff, during the interim, until such a time when appropriate employment could be matched. Councillor Mrs Wright shared her concerns that due to the reduction in staffing there was often a lack of cover during staff absence that lead to exceeding policy/procedure times for response to residents. She continued by sharing her view that by scrutinising this area problems to recruitment may be identified.

RESOLVED: That a report be provided to the September Committee informing of the number of agency staff and consultants that are currently working at Gosport Borough Council and the reason they would not become permanent staff

B. Work Programme

The Chairman highlighted the work programme attached to the agenda for the meeting and asked for comments. It was agreed that the work programme was fit for purpose.

1.0 Introduction

1.1 The topic was suggested for scrutiny at the 4th December 2014 meeting of the Overview & Scrutiny Committee.

1.2 The Gosport Society had written to the Chief Executive highlighting concern regarding the condition of the Interpretation Boards located within the Borough. The suggestion to scrutinise the boards with the assistance of the Gosport Society, Friends of Stokes Bay and other interested parties was proposed to the Committee and the Working Group was established, initially comprising Councillors Mrs Cully, Mrs Hook, Mrs Forder and Scard.

1.3 Councillor Mrs Cully and Mrs Hook were subsequently replaced by Councillors Mrs Batty and Hylands following a change to the membership of the Overview and Scrutiny Committee in May 2015.

2.0 Scope of Scrutiny

2.1 The initial meeting of the working group was on 20th April 2015 and was primarily to decide upon the scope for the scrutiny and how to move forward.

2.2 The Group were provided with copies of the information received from the Gosport Society, including a list of existing boards, their locations and their current condition.

2.3 Members agreed that they needed to establish how they would like to approach the review of the boards and felt that both a visit to the Boards and a meeting with the Gosport Society would be useful.

2.4 Members recognised that they would need input from not only the Gosport Society, but any 'Friends of' groups. The Lawrence family and the organisation responsible for Nat Gonella's memorials would also need to be consulted. It would also be considerate to contact ward Councillors and those that previously unveiled the boards. It would also need to be established if any of the boards were not owned by GBC

2.5 Members requested that a catalogue be made of all the boards listed, with photographs to allow them to make an informed decision as to which boards needed visiting and assessing.

3.0 Summary of Investigation

3.1 Following receipt of the catalogue of boards the Working Group established that contact would need to be made with the Railway Society, Friends of Stokes Bay, Gosport Society, Friends of the Hermitage, Friends of Crescent Gardens and the Lawrence Family to establish their priorities and thoughts regarding the Interpretation Boards.

3.2 Members recognised that a number of organisations had been involved with the boards over the years, including Hampshire County Council and Groundwork Solent. It was felt that they may need contacting with regard to any action to be taken with the boards.

3.3 It was established that the boards came in two differing forms, historical and ecological.

3.3 The Lawrence Family, Friends of Stokes Bay and the Gosport Society were subsequently invited to address the third meeting of the Group.

3.4 Kevin Casey, Friends of Stokes Bay, Howard Bennett, Gosport Society and Anthony Lawrence of the Lawrence family attended the third meeting of the Group.

3.5 Kevin Casey advised that the Friends of Stokes Bay had initially had input on the boards along the seafront, they still had copies of the information and requested that a new, panoramic board be installed opposite the splash park.

3.6 The Working Group, with the assistance of those present, discussed the location, content and condition of the existing boards, suggestions for amendments were made and relocation ideas were put forward. It was also suggested that the Railway Society be consulted and that the boards located at Stokes Bay be made more weather proof.

3.7 Mr Lawrence welcomed input into the project and welcomed credit for any Lawrence photographs included.

3.8 The Group established a priority list for works to the boards and identified those to be removed completely.

3.9 The Groups fourth meeting took place on 8th July and the Group were advised that correspondence had been received from the Friends of Crescent Gardens and they were happy for their board to be relocated.

3.10 The Group discussed materials for the boards, analysing the suitability for each given location. It was also advised that Ann Bevan, a local artist, had agreed to undertake the artwork for the panorama.

3.11 In addition, the Diving Museum suggested that they would like to take on the board identified as suitable for removal, located outside the museum.

3.11 The final meeting of the Group took place on 25th August 2015, Ann Bevan was present and offered her advice on the panorama project. The Group finalised their programme of works and received advice on the planning and legislative matters surrounding the replacement of the boards.

4.0 Summary of Findings

The Working Group's findings can be summarised as follows:

- 1. A number of the boards in the Borough are in poor condition.
- 2. There are large numbers of boards identified as unnecessary.
- 3. Some of the board content was acceptable, others needed renewing.
- 4. The introduction of QR codes to the boards was desirable.
- 5. The input of the difference societies and individuals to the boards was welcome.
- 6. The boards could be defined by priority of improvement into two separate lists, urgent, and ongoing maintenance.
- 7. The materials to be used for the boards needed to be analysed for their suitability and ability to withstand weather conditions.

5.0 Recommendations

5.1 The working group would ask that the Overview and Scrutiny Committee consider the following provisional findings and recommendations following its investigations.

- 1. the interpretation boards be renovated and upgraded from the funds in the capital programme as set out in Appendix 1
- 2. the Overview and Scrutiny Committee give consideration to the provisional findings of the Working Group and determine whether the report be published

Sucke Road has been established as a popular shopping centre since Victorian times, but old maps show that in the eightnessific century that road was a cent track with unclosures, fishis and ordinate, particularily on the north side. This is evident today with steeret names such as Stoke Gaudaus, old Street and Holly Street. St. Edward's Road and St. Audrew's Road wour built on the uno of extensive century.

In Stoke Road. The Vine Inn. dating from 1840, once had its own plansare grounds and elegani textrooms, while the Royal Arms P.H. is thought to have been the low public touse in Cospositio have its own hear. In addition, its attriking cast aron canopy with coloured glass inserts is a feature of the road and is typical of the mid-Victorian period. The custom end of Stoke Road is now designated a Conservation Area.

There are four charcines in Stoke Road of which the oldest is Christ Church (c. 1965). The Methodist Church at the Junction of Peel Road is Edwardian and was recently referibilised after a maps fire and is the only church in Gosport with a spire. The Church Referenced Church at the western end of Stoke Road is built on the size of the Stokes Bay mitway lise. There used to be a station at the rear of the present White Hart P.H. and the adjoining car park was once a bowling green.


Also at the western end of Stoke Road between Stone Lane and the approach to the White Hart P.H. is an attractive group²of buildings which were originally built in 1815.

Off Stoke Road in Peel Road (formerly Peel Terrace), now a Conservation Area, Peel Road was completed in 1842 and originally had gates at each end which were locked at dask. The area has recently been inhanced with finance from Hampshire County Cosneil through the Urban Regimeration Programme.









IB047 – HISTORY OF LEE PIER AND TOWER – MARINE PARADE CENTRAL, LEE 1/2





NOTES OF THE MEETING OF THE INTERPRETATION BOARDS WORKING GROUP HELD AT 16.00 ON MONDAY, 20 APRIL 2015

Membership: Councillors Mrs Cully, Mrs Forder(P), Mrs Hook(P) and Scard.

Apologies were received from Councillors Scard and Mrs Cully.

Officers: Lisa Young, Sam Voller and Ian Lycett.

1 Background

- 1.1 This was the first meeting of the group.
- 1.2 The Gosport Society had written to the Council expressing concern at the condition of the interpretation boards in the Borough, they had undertaken a survey of them and found that many were in need of repair or replacement.
- 1.3 The Group were provided with a copy of the letter sent by the Gosport Society and a copy of the survey of the condition of the boards.
- 1.4 The Overview and Scrutiny Committee had agreed to set up a working group to explore the refurbishment of the boards.

- 2.1 The Group were provided with copies of the information received from the Gosport Society, it included a list of existing boards, their locations and their current condition.
- 2.2 Members agreed that they needed to establish how they would like to approach the review of the boards and felt that both a visit to the boards and a meeting with the Gosport Society would be useful.

- 2.3 Members recognised that they would need input from not only the Gosport Society, but any 'Friends of' groups. The Lawrence family and the organisation responsible for Nat Gonella's memorials would also need to be consulted. It would also be considerate to contact ward Councillors and those that previously unveiled the boards. It would also need to be established if any of the boards were not owned by GBC
- 2.4 In addition to the condition of the boards, the content including amount of information, whether a QR needed to be included, photographic content would all need to be discussed.
- 2.5 In addition the material the boards were made from needed to be given consideration.
- 2.6 Members were advised that each board cost approximately £1000 and that there was £39000 in the capital programme. This would also need to cover boards for the D Day memorial.
- 2.7 Members agreed that it would be best to have an understanding of the content and style of boards before meeting with the Gosport Society.
- 2.8 SV agreed to photograph and catalogue each board and provide a pack for the next meeting of the Group. Members agreed that they would then decide which boards needed visiting, and undertake such visits.
- 2.9 The packs would include colour photographs, location plans and the Gosport Society review of the board.
- 2.10 Members recognised that once complete, a maintenance programme for the boards would need to be established.

3 <u>Conclusion</u>

3.1 That the group be provided with information about the boards and establish a plan to visit the boards to examine them further.

- 2.3 It was also recognised that the content of the boards maybe owned by different people and societies.
- 2.4 The Group requested that the Gosport Society, Friends of Stokes Bay and the Lawrence family should be invited in to discuss their boards with the group.
- 2.5 It was acknowledged that the Alver Valley boards would be amended and updated in line with the work on Alver Valley Country Park.

It was recognised that the wooden post designs were attractive.

1 Background

- 1.1 This was the third meeting of the group.
- 1.2 Invitations had been extended to Anthony Lawrence, of the Lawrence family Kevin Casey from the Friends of Stokes Bay and Howard Bennett of the Gosport Society.

- 2.1 The Group spoke with Kevin Casey of the Friends of Stokes Bay to establish the priorities for the boards located there.
- 2.2 He advised that the Friends had previously had input in board numbers 14, 20, 35 of the pack and still had the artwork for them.
- 2.3 It was suggested that board number 35, currently located at the splashpool be relocated to one of the car parks near to the entrance to the Alverbank.
- 2.4 It was suggested that it be replaced with a panoramic picture of Stokes Bay detailing points of interest and landmarks. It could potentially be moved slightly to be positioned nearer the telescope.
- 2.5 It was suggested that board 41 was little used and could therefore potentially be removed.

- 2.6 It was also felt that the frames for the boards should be standardised and complimented the new boards in the Alver Valley.
- 2.7 It was recognised that the board's material would need to be able to withstand the elements, in particular the sea water.
- 2.8 It was felt that the board currently located on Fort Road would be better located along the footpath to explain the lagoons and pools.
- 2.9 It was agreed that boards 15 and 49 could be removed and replaced with a single board on Jackie Spencer bridge and that the Gosport Railway Society would be best placed to provide the content.
- 2.10 It was agreed that board number 40 could be removed following the addition of the boards to the cycle lane at Stokes Bay.
- 2.11 It was felt that the board at the railway station needed improving and replacing as it was out of date.
- 2.12 It was agreed that the boards at the Hermitage would need further investigation, but that contact needed to be made with the friends of the garden to progress this further.
- 2.13 It was also recognised that the Friends of Crescent Gardens should be consulted on any proposal for the board located there.
- 2.14 The Group acknowledged that the board on Stoke Road was probably not looked at.
- 2.15 The group also acknowledged that the boards in the Alver Valley and the wild grounds would be covered by the work to make Alver Valley a country park.
- 2.16 The Group felt that the board at Osborne Gardens needed to be replaced and relocated.
- 2.17 The Group felt that the content of the boards on the High Street was acceptable, but that they could do with cleaning up.
- 2.18 The Group commended the quality of the sign on the Millennium Bridge.
- 2.19 The Group felt that the board opposite St Vincent on Forton Road was not required.
- 2.20 The Gosport Society advised that they had access to the art work for

boards 14, 20, 35.

- 2.21 The group felt it was important to establish who had contributed financially and to the content of the boards.
- 2.22 Mr Lawrence advised that he would welcome the opportunity to involve the Lawrence family in the updating of the board in Lawrence Square.
- 2.23 The opportunity to review and credit any Lawrence pictures was also welcome.
- 2.24 Kevin Casey advised that he knew of people that would potentially be willing to contribute artwork for the new boards.

3 <u>Conclusion</u>

- 3.1 That the following boards needed action as a top priority
- 3.2 Boards number 14, 20 and 35 be updated and replaced with board 35 moving west to a car park nearer to the Alverbank
- 3.3 That a panoramic board be installed by the splash pool detailing the bay and its contents.
- 3.4 That the boards in the Hermitage and Crescent Gardens should be discussed with the friends of both areas
- 3.5 That boards 15 and 49 be removed and replaced with a board, with input from the Gosport Railway Society.
- 3.6 That board 40 be removed.
- 3.7 That the board opposite St Vincent be removed.
- 3.8 That the Lawrence board be updated

SV advised that 'Signs and Lines' were providing quotes for the individual elements of each board; they also included any graphic work that needed undertaking.


SV reiterated that the replacements, removal and installation of boards would require planning permission.
