
On behalf of all the staff at Gosport Borough Council, we would like to wish you a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.

ID NEEDED AT MAY VOTE

You will need to show identification before you can vote at a polling station in the local elections in May 2018.

This is because we have signed up to a national trial of using ID when voting, as a way of making elections more secure.

The trial, being run by the Cabinet Office, also involves councils in Bromley, Watford and Woking. It comes after reports of alleged electoral fraud through voter impersonation more than doubled between 2014 and 2016 nationally.

To vote, you will need to produce ID before being issued with a ballot paper in the polling station.

Graeme Jesty, Gosport Borough Council's Head of Electoral Services said "There's no evidence of any electoral fraud or impersonation in our borough but we are happy to help make sure that confidence is maintained in the national democratic process."

Next year's trial is likely to be the first in a series to allow the Electoral Commission and Cabinet Office to evaluate the impact of asking for ID, before a decision is taken to whether or not to roll out nationally. Many countries have already made it a requirement to prove identity at a polling station, including Northern Ireland.

The forms of ID that will be accepted by Gosport Borough Council will be announced soon.

TENANCY FRAUD

Tenancy fraud occurs when a council or housing association property is occupied by someone who is not entitled to be there. It is estimated that tenancy related fraud nationally costs the tax payer £900 Million every year.

As a housing provider we have to make the best use of the homes we own and ensure that the people living in our properties are legally entitled to be there.

People who are already in need of social housing and on the waiting list will have to wait even longer if homes continue to be occupied by people who have no right to live there.

What is tenancy fraud?

There are different types of tenancy fraud including:

- Unlawful subletting where a tenant rents out their home without the knowledge or permission of the landlord.
- Wrongly claimed succession where the resident dies and someone tries to take over or succeed the tenancy which they are not entitled to.
- False Right to Buy/Right to Acquire where a tenant resident makes a Right to Buy or Right to Acquire application and gives false information in their application.
- Key selling where a resident is paid to pass on their keys in return for a one-off payment.
- Unlawful assignment where a resident stops using their tenancy as their main or principal home, allowing another person to live there without permission.
- Obtaining housing by deception where a person gets a home by giving false information on their housing application.

What Gosport Borough Council does to tackle tenancy fraud?

We carry out regular tenancy audits as part of our letting and housing management to make sure that the right people are living in our properties.

We work with other social landlords and statutory agencies to detect fraud where the law requires it or where information sharing protocols are in place.

REPAIRS ROUND UP FOR 2016/17

Since the beginning of April 2017 up to the end of October 2017, we have completed some major planned works and milestones.

We have:

- Installed 60 new kitchens
- Installed 63 new bathrooms
- Rewired 19 properties
- Installed new central heating to 114 properties (consisting of 25 full installations, 67 boiler replacements and 22 radiator replacements)
- Installed 53 composite doors
- Carried out 47 disabled adaptations (consisting of 37 level access showers, 9 over bath showers and 1 major adaptation)

Replacement roofs

Flat roof replacement continues across the borough with the completion of Archer House and the start of the final roof of the year at 60-69 Chester Court. The final phase of roofing at Chester Court, which includes the last three roofs, will start in April 2018.

External wall insulation

Work have now been carried out at Elmore Avenue and are now nearing completion at Archer House. No further works are planned for the year. The final part of the Archer House refurbishment, (now that the roof and cladding the rear have been completed) is the communal decoration which will take place in early 2018.

External Improvements

We have started work on the external refurbishment of one of the blocks at The Anchorage. These five storey blocks have been the subject of many years of planning and discussion regarding the specific works required to the walls. We have witnessed a notable deterioration over recent years especially due to their height and exposed location in the borough. This was confirmed when we started receiving a high number of damp related calls especially in the storm-like conditions encountered in 2014.

Work started on Ramillies House a few weeks ago. The work includes fully repointing the walls, removing the fragile plastic cladding and replacing with new, ensuring that insulation is installed beforehand. Part of the work also includes wall tie replacement and crack repairs.

This work will be completed by Christmas with the other three blocks being carried out.

Sheltered scheme upgrade

Gloucester House is complete! After some delays with structural issues, we have now overcome all the hurdles and have a scheme that we can be really proud of. The residents now benefit from a new and more open arrangement within the communal lounge that includes a galley style kitchen. There are two additional buggy store areas, one located in the former bathroom on the ground floor and an external pod that faces Oak Street. Most of the external doors have been changed to an aluminium alternative. This is to reduce longer term

maintenance costs and is more robust and secure when compared to the original wooden doors.





Internally around the communal areas, we have changed all the doors to an oak style, improving the overall appearance as well as providing greater fire resistance.

Finally, decoration and furnishings complement the refurbishment with wallpaper features being applied on both floors, art

New Garden Waste Club

A new garden waste club will offer Gosport residents greater convenience and environmental benefits.

Currently residents have to travel to buy special green garden waste sacks when they want to dispose of their garden waste. The new scheme will see residents who sign up, given a wheelie bin specifically for garden waste.

The new bins will hold four times as much as the current sacks and will be collected from outside your home every fortnight.

The current collection methods require collection vehicles to drive along every road in the borough. The new scheme will be better for the environment as they will only travel to registered homes. There will also be no plastic waste from the sacks and recycling rates could increase as garden waste collections count towards them.

Residents using garden waste collections for the first time will save time by not needing to travel to the household waste and recycling centre. Also the new club can help save money for residents who currently buy the garden sacks, depending on how regularly they use the scheme. In turn it will save council taxpayers money as the scheme will be more efficient to run.

Gosport Borough Council's Community Board has approved plans for the new garden waste club, operated by Urbaser, to begin in February 2018.

A yearly subscription to the service will cost £60.00, but an early bird offer means that anyone subscribing before January will pay just £55.00 for their first year. Reduced rates are available for people joining partway through the year. A monthly direct debit subscription scheme is being investigated.

Collections will take place between February and October, inclusive, when garden waste collections are most used, and there will also be a special Christmas tree collection during January.

Collection days will stay the same as they currently are, with five different zones in the borough collected on different days.

Residents will still be able to take any garden waste to the household waste and recycling centre free of charge, and anyone with the current garden waste sacks will be able to keep using them until 23rd March 2018.

Councillor Graham Burgess, Chairman of Gosport Borough Councils Community Board said "The new garden waste club will give residents more convenience in aettina rid of their garden waste, instead of having to go and buy specific sacks they will always have the wheelie bin ready to use."

They removed the existing patio, sanded and painted the existing


bench, laid a new patio area, assembled and planted new raised beds and built a new brick BBQ.

Are you ready for Universal **Credit?**

Universal

What is **Universal Credit?**

From August 2018 a new government benefit called Universal Credit will be introduced in Gosport. Universal Credit is a new simpler, single monthly payment for people in or out of work, which will eventually join together some of the benefits and tax credits that you might be getting now. It will support working age people with their basic living expenses and housing costs and replaces the following benefits:

- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Income Support
- Housing Benefit
- Working Tax Credit
- Child Tax Credit

How to Claim

You will be expected to make your Universal Credit application online at www.gov.uk/apply-universal-credit.

You cannot backdate your Universal Credit claim so it is important that you make your claim as soon as possible.

Please give time to complete your application; it may take 40 minutes or more. Once you start an application you cannot save it part way through, so you need to ensure you have all the information required to make a claim before your start filling in the new application

To make a claim, you will need:

- Your national insurance number
- Details of the bank, building society or Post Office account that you want the Universal Credit paid into
- Your Tenancy Agreement (if you have one)
- Details of your savings or other capital
- Details on any other benefits you are getting

If you do not have access to a computer at home or do not have family or friends that can assist you, there are computers available at the Gosport Jobcentre Plus and in your local library. A self-serve computer is also available for your use in the Benefits Section at Gosport Borough Council Town Hall, Monday to Friday, 9am to 5pm.

If you need help to make your Universal Credit claim online, support is available by telephoning Gosport Borough Council on 023 9254 5635 or by visiting the Town Hall in person, Monday to Friday 9am to 5pm.

What happens to existing claims?

If you are claiming any of the benefits which are being replaced your claim will continue, unless you have a change in circumstances which triggers a claim for Universal Credit. Eventually you will be moved onto Universal Credit even if you have no change in circumstances.

Universal Credit does not include help to pay your Council Tax. You can still claim Local Council Tax Support from Gosport Borough Council by contacting the Benefits Department on 023 9254 5325 or email benefits@gosport.gov.uk

Universal Credit is paid in a different way to current benefits:

- It will be paid monthly into an account you choose.
- If you get help with your rent, this will be included in your monthly payment - you'll then pay the landlord yourself.

If you are in receipt of Universal Credit (Housing Costs element) and you are struggling to pay any shortfall in your rent, you can apply to Gosport Borough Council for a Discretionary Housing Payment (DHP). If you need independent advice...

If you need independent advice on a range of issues, including rent arrears you can get it from Gosport's Citizen Advice (CA) Bureau.

CA Gosport is manned Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday 9am-5pm and 9am-7pm on Wednesday by staff and volunteers. The drop-in service is open Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday 9.30am – 3pm.

For those in work or have care needs meaning they are unable to attend during the daytime, CA Gosport offer an evening service on Wednesday 5pm-7pm.

Outside of the drop-in service hours they provide appointments for specialist casework projects, manning the CA Advice-line and National CA web-chat service.

The Hampshire Advice-line is available Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday 9am-5pm, Wednesday 9am-6.30pm and Saturday 10am-12pm.

Are you having money worries?

The Council treats rent arrears very seriously. Your rent pays for the housing services that all tenants receive, if there is a shortfall, everyone stands to lose.

Every consideration is given to people who are having genuine difficulties, but collecting rent must be the priority for the Council to provide the services that you need.

Christmas

Christmas is looming fast; it is easy to overspend on gifts instead of paying the rent. So before it is spent, pay the rent! For tips on how to save money on Christmas please see the 'Budgeting for Christmas' article.

Rent Free Weeks

There is a chance to catch up during the two 'rent free weeks' beginning Monday 18th and 25th December. This is an ideal time to pay off/reduce your arrears.

Help is at hand

If you are having problems paying your rent get in touch with your Neighbourhood Housing Officer on 023 9254 5665.

There are many ways to pay You do not have to visit the Town Hall to pay your rent.

You do not have to visit the Town Hall to pay your rent. You can pay by the telephone using your credit/debit card on 023 9254 5665 or 023 9258 4242 if paying rent and council tax together. You can also pay online, direct debit, standing order or by Paypoint/Allpay card. Please contact your Neighbourhood Housing Officer to discuss your chosen method of payment.

Paying your rent on time and keeping a clear rent account entitles you to receive other services, such as renting a garage, the fencing scheme and home swap exchanges.

If the Council is forced to take legal action against you to recover your rent arrears, you may be liable to court costs and, if recovery proceedings result in County Court Judgements (CCJ), it will affect your ability to get credit.

Please remember, if you are having difficulties, it is vital that you contact your Neighbourhood Housing Officer without delay to see how they can help you.

Budgeting for Christmas

Christmas is coming and we all know that it can be an expensive time where we all need to make our money go further.

Here are some tips that may help you save.

Plan ahead: When making a Christmas shopping list, also include items such as Christmas cards, wrapping paper, gift tags and sticky tape; perhaps buy in bulk and share with family and friends.

Make the most of toy offers: Buying everything listed on a child's Christmas list could bring you to the point of bankruptcy, make the most of pre-Christmas toy offers and try searching 'Christmas discount codes' online.

Give the gift of time: It is the thought that counts – give your nearest and dearest homemade vouchers instead of presents that they won't use. An IOU for homemade cupcakes, doing the ironing for the week, washing the car etc. will go down well, and who wouldn't rather have a voucher for an evening of babysitting instead of another pair of socks!

Get Father Christmas to think practically: Every child loves a bulging stocking, so top up the toys with practical presents like new socks, toothbrush and bubble bath. These are all items that you will need to buy anyway but your child will get the pleasure of unwrapping them.

Start a family 'Secret Santa': Try arranging a 'Secret Santa' where everyone buys one decent present within an agreed budget for another family member, it saves money and everyone gets a present.

Only buy for the kids: Arrange with your friends or siblings. Buy just for their children, and they buy for yours.

Warm Home Discount

You could get £140 off your electricity bill for Winter 2017 to 2018 under the 'Warm Home' Discount Scheme. The money isn't paid to you; it is a 'one off' discount on your electricity bill, between September and March.

You may be able to get the discount on your gas bill instead if your supplier provides you with both gas and electricity. Contact your supplier to find out.

The discount won't affect your 'Cold Weather' Payment or 'Winter Fuel' Payment.

Eligibility

There are two ways to qualify for the Warm Home Discount Scheme:

- You get the Guarantee Credit element of Pension Credit – you qualify for the discount if on 9th July 2017 all of the following applied:
 - Your energy supplier was part of the scheme.
 - Your name (or your partner's name) was on the bill.
 - You were getting the Guarantee Credit element of Pension Credit.
- You're on a low income and meet your energy suppliers criteria for the scheme:
 - Your energy supplier is part of the scheme
 - You're on a low income
 - You get certain means-tested benefits

Pre-pay or pay-as-you-go meters

You can still qualify for the discount if you use a pre-pay or pay-as-you-go electricity meter.

Your electricity supplier can tell you how you'll get the discount if you are eligible.

How to pay your Housing Charges

Rent is due in advance either weekly or monthly. Your rent, charges or arrears can be paid in the following ways:

- Direct Debit paid monthly via your own bank or building society on 1st, 8th, 15th or 22nd of each month. This can now be set up over the telephone by contacting 023 9254 5665, when setting up please ensure that the bank account holder is present. Direct Debit mandates are available on request.
- Over the telephone Call 023 9254 5665 to pay using your debit or credit card, between 9am and 5pm. If you want to make multiple payments for rent, council tax and any other payments please call 023 9258 4242.
- Standing Order Weekly, fortnightly, four weekly or monthly through your bank. GBC Bank sort code is 57-81-43 and account number is 00000000 – Borough of Gosport. Please quote your rent reference number when setting up this payment.
- Faster/Online Payment set this up online or with your bank using the account details, GBC Bank sort code is 57-81-43 and account number is 00000000 – Borough of Gosport. Please quote your rent reference number when setting up this payment.
- In person pay at the Town Hall cash desk by cash, cheque, debit or credit card between 9am and 4.45pm.

- All Pay card Pay at the Town Hall or your local pay point/shop/post office. Please call 023 9254 5665 to request an All Pay card.
- Outside office hours Via the post or through the secure letterbox at the front of the Town Hall (it is not advisable to send cash as the Council cannot accept any responsibility for any payments lost.) Cheques and postal orders should be made payable to 'Gosport Borough Council'. Your account number, name and address should be written on the back of the cheque/postal order and the envelope should be securely sealed.

Save on energy bills with Gosport Borough Councils' Energy Switching Service

Energy prices this winter are set to rise, with some suppliers raising prices to cope with winter demand which means that switching savings are currently at a record high. Ofgem reported that 70% of customers are still on a standard variable tariff; this means that you could be paying around £300 extra on your energy bills each year.

Switching your energy is simpler than you think, simply take a look at www.gosport.ukpower.co.uk, have an energy bill to hand and see how much less you could be paying for your electricity and gas. If you can't go online, ring 0800 860 6838, to speak to one of the switching advisors for **FREE**.

So far Gosport residents have saved an average £260 per household. The service offers independent tariff advice and cuts out the need for you to ring energy suppliers or change direct debits.

If you need help with the switching service, please ring 0800 860 6838 where one of the advisors will be happy to help you.

Cold Weather Payment

You may get a 'Cold Weather' Payment if you are getting the benefits listed below:

- Pension Credit
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Universal Credit

You will get a payment if the average temperature in your area is recorded as, or forecast to be, zero degrees Celsius or below for seven consecutive days.

You will get a payment of £25 for each seven day period of very cold weather between 1st November and 31st March.



Winter Fuel Payment

If you were born on or before 5th August 1953 you could get between £100 and £300 to help you pay your heating bills. This is known as a 'Winter Fuel Payment'.

You usually get a Winter Fuel Payment automatically if:

- you were born on or before 5th August 1953
- you were living in the UK for at least one day during the week of 18th to 24th September 2017

As well as the State Pension or another Social Security Benefit (not Housing Benefit, Council Tax, Child Benefit or Universal Credit).

Most payments are made automatically between November and December. You should get your money by 15th January.

Any money you get won't affect your benefits.

Pension Credit

Pension Credit age is the 'cut off' point at which someone is no longer classed as 'working age' for means-tested benefit purposes. To check when you will reach Pension Credit age use the online checker at www.gov.uk/state-pension-age.

Make an advance claim

Anyone due to reach Pension Credit age within the next four months can make an advance claim for Pension Credit where the claim can be processed and payments can start as soon as possible after you have reached Pension Credit age.

Currently getting Universal Credit

It is even more important for those who get Universal Credit and who are approaching Pension Credit age to make an advance claim for Pension Credit as you may miss out on money if you don't claim in advance.

- Arrange a FREE telephone advice service to help with benefits, debt and other money
- Refer you for further energy efficiency improvements, such as loft insulation or a new boiler.

Are you eligible?

You may be eligible for the LEAP service if you:

- · have a low income
- receive tax credits
- · receive Housing Benefit
- receive an income or disability related benefit
- have a long term illness or disability



If you struggle to pay your energy bills, or live in a cold home, then you could qualify for **FREE** support.

LEAP (Local Energy Advice Programme) is a **FREE** home visit service available to all Gosport residents; it offers energy saving advice, help with finding a cheaper energy deal, and they could fit energy-saving kit such as LED lightbulbs, radiator panels and draught-proofing.

The service is **FREE** and they have already helped more than 60 residents.

You can qualify in lots of ways. To see if you are eligible, they will look at things like your income, your health, your family situation and whether you are on benefits.

Help finding a job

Gosport Employment and Skills Fair will be on Thursday 25th January 2018 at Gosport Leisure Centre. It's for anyone looking for a job or apprenticeship, keen to get a new skill or qualification, or needing careers information.

The Gosport Employment and Skills Fair (GE&SF) attracts on average 50 exhibitors and 700 visitors. It regularly has at least 30 employers promoting hundreds of job and apprenticeship vacancies, plus career opportunities.

As well as employment support, training organisations and education establishments will be on hand.

The employment fair has been run annually (since 2012) by Gosport Borough Council to promote locally available jobs, apprenticeships and training opportunities to residents – both employed and unemployed.



It aims to help:

- Residents find jobs and apprenticeships, get new skills or start a business in Gosport;
- Local employers to recruit new staff and promote career opportunities.

It brings together employers, employment support organisations, training providers and education establishments all under one roof.

Although primarily aimed at job seeking adults and young people, it is also aimed at pupils and students to help them get a better understanding of the future career opportunities and skills needed.

Employer exhibitors promote job and apprenticeship vacancies, plus career opportunities, within the following sectors:

- Business and professional services
- Construction
- Health and care
- Engineering and manufacturing, including aerospace, marine and defence
- Public sector
- Research and development
- Tourism, leisure and retail

January 2017 event was the biggest yet in terms of exhibitors and employers, outcomes include:

- 467 CVs/job applications were submitted on the day
- 167 people registered as new clients with support organisations to help them into employment or get new skills
