1. BACKGROUND

1.1 Voluntary and Community Groups are able to apply for grants from the annual revenue budget available to the Grants Sub Board.

2. RELATE PORTSMOUTH & DISTRICT

2.1 Relate Portsmouth & District established in 1962 is based at Isambard Brunel Road, Portsmouth and has an outreach centre at the Rowner Children's Centre.

- 2.2 Relate offers relationship counselling to individuals, couples and families. The full cost of a counselling session is £45 from 1 May 2009. To ensure that lack of ability to pay does not preclude people from attending, subsidised sessions are provided based on income.
- 2.3 Between April 2008 and March 2009 a total of 504 sessions were provided to 98 Gosport clients costing a total of £20,160. The average client contribution was £18.54 per session, total client contribution £9,345.
- 2.4 Relate Portsmouth & District request a grant of £5,000 towards as estimated cost of:

3. VITALISE

3.1 Vitalise set up in July 1963 operates 4 care centres in England including Netley Waterside, Hampshire that provide breaks for disabled people and their carers.

- 3.2 The care centres are open for eleven months of the year providing over 8,000 weeks of breaks every year. The fully accessible centres run an extensive programme of short breaks in a holiday setting with 24 hour on call care in a relaxed environment.
- 3.3 Last year 22 weeks of breaks were provided for 19 Gosport residents and 3 Gosport residents gave 17 weeks of volunteering. Each care break is subsidised at £302 by Vitalise. Volunteer costs (travel, living and security checks) amount to £215 per week.

- 5.2 The Group has a total of 140 members, 62% live in the Borough. Members are able to take part in a range of activities at various venues throughout the Borough and in Fareham. Activities that build confidence and self esteem are offered including Mother & Toddler, Tuesday Cafe Club, Inkspot Group, Lunch Group, Activities Group, Sports Group etc
- 5.3 A recent survey showed that Gosport members would be interested in taking part in a drama group, the venue is yet to be decided but likely venues are; Brune Park school, The Crossways or Stoke Road Methodist Church. The project will initially run for one year with a view to staging a performance to bring in further funds.

8. LEE ON THE SOLENT TENNIS, SQUASH & FITNESS CLUB (Junior Squash Player)

- 8.1 An application was last made in support of this junior squash player in 2007, at that time he had an England Under 13 Ranking of 34, in the 19 months since he has moved up the rankings to his current position of 4th and hopes to move up to 3rd in July.
- 8.2 Over the last six months he has been a regular attendee at Hampshire County, South East England and England Squad training sessions at various venues around the country. He is the No 1 ranked player in both the Hampshire County and South East England teams and locally he is competing for his club in the Hampshire Men's League.
- 8.3 In March of this year he became a Junior International representing England in a Home International Tournament in Dublin where he played extremely well winning all three of his matches 3-0.
- 8.4 His next target is to be selected for England in May 2011 to represent his country in the European Under 15 Championships, his long term aim is to represent England at the 2024 Olympics.
- 8.5 For the 2008/09 season just ending he was successful in receiving a County Councillor grant of £500 and a Hampshire Talented Athlete Scheme grant of £215 which has helped ensure he has had a successful year.

- 8.6 Unfortunately applications to The Rotary Club, Waitrose Community Fund, The Lions, Quay Lane Boat Yard, Biscoe's Solicitors and Nationwide Services for the forthcoming season have all been unsuccessful.

- 10.1 Gosport Borough Netball Club was formed in 2003. The club currently has 72 members all of whom are under 18 years of age and a majority live in Gosport.
- 10.2 The club train and play their matches at St. Vincent Leisure Centre on Mondays, Wednesdays and Thursdays 6.00 7.00 pm and Tuesdays 5:30 9.00 pm. Members pay £1.50 per session.
- 10.3 The club teach children and young adults all aspects of Netball such as ball skills, movement, game play, rules and umpiring.
- 10.4 The club would like to enter all players from years 6 to 11 (52 in total) on the "All England" Umpiring Course. - 12.1 Little Shipmates Pre-School was formed in 2004. The Pre-School currently has 57 members all of whom are under 5 years of age and live in Gosport.
- 12.2 Little Shipmates are based at Lee Community Centre on Monday to Friday mornings and Monday and Wednesday afternoons. Members who are under 3 years old are charged £7.50 per session when they become eligible for the Nursery Education Grant.
- 12.3 The organisation is a voluntary sector Pre-School for children from 2 years 9 months upwards (although this will change to 2 years shortly to meet Government guidelines) and they follow the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum.
- 12.4 Outside the hall is a hard surfaced area for the children to play on. In order to introduce more challenging apparatus and additional play equipment they require safety flooring.
- 12.5 Little Shipmates have a fundraising committee that was established a few months ago. A Summer Fair at the Community Centre on Sunday 7 June and a School Fair on 27 June are planned as well as stalls at the St. Faiths fair on 13 June.
- 12.6 If the organisation is successful with their application they will be able to offer more activities by next autumn.
