Application for Small Business Rate Relief 2017

Ratepayers who occupy a property with a rateable value which does not exceed £50,999 (and who are not entitled to other mandatory relief or are liable for unoccupied property rates) will have their bills calculated using the lower small business non-domestic rating multiplier, rather than the national non-domestic rating multiplier. This is automatically applied to rates bills.

Qualifying Criteria for additional relief.

In addition, generally, if the sole or main property is shown on the rating list with a rateable value which does not exceed £15,000, the ratepayer will receive a percentage reduction in their rates bill for this property of up to a maximum of 100%. For a property with a rateable value of not more than £12,000, the ratepayer will receive a 100% reduction in their rates bill.

Generally, this percentage reduction (relief) is only available to ratepayers who occupy either-(a) one property, or

(b) one main property and other additional properties providing those additional properties each have a rateable value which does not exceed £2,899.

The rateable value of the property mentioned in (a), or the aggregate rateable value of all the properties mentioned in (b), must not exceed £19,999 outside London or £27,999 in London on each day for which relief is being sought. If the rateable value, or aggregate rateable value, increases above those levels, relief will cease from the day of the increase.

c) For those businesses that take on an additional property which would normally have meant the loss of small business rate relief, there is now provision for a temporary extension of entitlement for up to 12 months from the date the additional property is occupied.

The properties must have a qualifying rateable value for everyday that the relief is claimed.

The Ratepayer is under a legal duty to notify the Local Authority of any changes that may affect their entitlement to the relief. (e.g.: A change in the rateable value, Occupation of another property)
