## Take steps to protect yourself from e-bike and e-scooter battery fire risks

E-bikes offer a great way to get about and thousands of people enjoy cycling using these products. While most e-bikes, e-scooters and their batteries are safe when used correctly, lithium-ion batteries can cause serious fires, particularly if of poor quality, when damaged or improperly used.

You can take steps to protect yourself and other and reduce the risk of fires:

- ⊘ Check product reviews and only buy from trusted sellers.
- Only use manufacturer recommended batteries and chargers.
- Get professional guidance when converting a bike into an e-bike.
- Oon't let the battery get too hot through over charging.
- On't leave your device charging unattended or when you are asleep.
- On't charge or store your battery in the hallway or where it could block escape routes.

#### **Important notice: Evacuation Assistance**

If you know you'll need help in the event of an evacuation from your home, please contact your housing officer or scheme manager to highlight this and undergo a personal risk assessment.

If you're not sure whether you'd need help, we can ask Hampshire and Isle of Wight Fire and Rescue to undertake a free Safe and Well visit to decide the best action in the event of evacuation.

#### **Recycling Batteries**

#### All batteries and electrical products should display the 'Crossed out wheelie bin' symbol.

This means they should not be put into your household rubbish when they no longer work or are no longer wanted. Instead, they should be taken to an appropriate collection point for recycling.

## Why bother doing this? The two main reasons are:

- Waste batteries and electrical products can leak toxic chemicals into the environment if they end up in a landfill site.
- They can be processed at a recycling plant to extract metals and other valuable resources for new products.

There's also a safety issue to bear in mind, as some types of battery (lithium-ion) can catch fire if dumped in your rubbish bin, particularly if they get wet or are damaged.

You can take most waste batteries to your local supermarket for recycling. Alternatively, the link below shows the local recycling banks in Gosport. All batteries, apart from those designed for vehicles or industrial use, can be dropped off for recycling this way.



The terminals of lithium batteries should ideally be taped up first, to prevent any risk of fire. The one exception is where the battery is part of the device and cannot be taken out, in items such as calculators and e-cigarettes. These need to be treated as electrical products and disposed of at the local household waste recycling centre.

#### We're backing a battery fire safety campaign

Our councillors are backing a national campaign calling for greater safety around lithium batteries, following a major fire in the town recently. Eight homes in Hill Park Road were severely damaged by a fire in June. The fire service has said it was most likely caused by an e-scooter which caught fire while on charge.

The council is supporting a call on the government to introduce new laws to ensure greater safety around the sale and use of lithium batteries.

Remember, don't leave batteries on charge overnight.

The winter months can be a difficult time for many people in our local community. The colder weather can lead to a significant increase in energy costs and with this some people find that it can become much harder to manage financially.

On average a household will use 36% less energy in summer than in the winter months.

## **DISREPAIR** If you're thinking of making a claim, talk to us first.

As a council tenant you may have seen or heard adverts from claims management companies about making a disrepair claim against your landlord. These adverts feature regularly on social media and radio at the moment. These companies may even have called or emailed you directly.

Claims management companies target tenants, particularly those in social housing, and encourage them to make a claim for disrepair.

A housing disrepair claim is a type of legal case that involves a tenant taking legal action against their landlord for either failing to fix repairs to their home in a reasonable time frame, or failing to complete them at all.

If you agree to pursue this, the claims management company will sell your claim to a solicitor who will act as an intermediary between you and your landlord (us) and handle your claim, at a cost.

#### The downsides of disrepair claims

Although the sales pitch from these companies may sound good, there can be many downsides to pursuing this, including:

- **Hidden costs** You may be asked to pay for an insurance policy, and may be responsible for solicitors fees and legal costs if your claim is not successful, and under some other circumstances.
- Fees if you change your mind If you want to stop the process, you'll usually have to pay for all the costs incurred up to that point.
- **Time taken and distress caused** Some cases can take years to resolve and you may have to appear in court which can be very stressful.
- Breach of your tenancy agreement If you pursue a disrepair claim these companies will usually advise you not to allow access to your landlord during that time. This would put you in breach of your tenancy agreement.

We want to keep your home safe and in good repair, for both your benefit and ours, so we strongly encourage you to cooperate with us so we can achieve that together.

The Social Housing (Regulation) Act 2023 made important changes to the regulator of social housing objectives. New monitoring and inspections routines are now being introduced.

#### What this means for you as a Council tenant:

## **Tenancy Update Visits (TUV)**

Your Housing Officer or Older Persons Support Officer will be making a yearly visit to your property. The aims of these visits are to:

- Ensure that the information we hold on the household is up-to-date and relevant;
- support anyone in need, including signposting relevant agencies and services;
- check the property is still suitable for your needs;
- check the condition of the property, including any unreported repairs;
- identify and address any breaches of tenancy, such as debt;
- identify and tackle incidents of suspected tenancy fraud, or other illegal activity.

## Stock Condition Surveys

Gosport Borough Council is required to undertake a Stock Condition Survey of all its properties. This is an important assessment of the condition of the main elements of GBC property, including the roof, windows, external doors, kitchen, and bathroom. To ensure your home is safe and free from any serious hazards.

Surveys will take place over the next 12 months and you will be notified by letter. The appointment is expected to take approximately 45 minutes.

It's really important that you allow us access for these visits, so we can ensure you are looking after your home in line with your tenancy agreement, and to ensure the information we hold about your household is correct.



#### You said, we listened Hove Court – bike storage

Laura Wise, Neighbourhood Housing Officer said "I completed a site visit with Chris Murphy from the neighbourhood services team to look at the issues faced by tenants and leaseholders. I spoke to a few residents on site to understand the issues they were facing with storing their bikes and accessing them from the bike store.

We put a plan in action to find a solution. Firstly I wrote to all residents and leaseholders asking them to identify their bike clearly as we would be removing any broken or unclaimed bikes within 28 days. After the 28 day period we returned and noted that a number of bikes still had not been claimed or identified so we took these bikes and stored them at the depot for a further 28 days – another letter was sent to residents to tell them that any bikes not claimed from the storage would be disposed of. We did look at donating to a recycling centre however the bikes left were in poor condition and could not be passed on.

The estate warden team then cleaned out the storage and fitted in a bike rack to make the access and storage better for everyone that uses it."

## **St Vincent College students record climate change songs**



#### Indie musician helps students write and record climate change songs for vinyl

Students from two college music departments are collaborating on writing and recording two songs highlighting the issue of climate change, which they will publish as a double A-side vinyl single with the help of a chart-topping Indie musician Jack Flanagan.

The Art For Earth's Sake project is being guided by St Vincent Sixth Form College, Gosport, music teacher Joe Chilcott and his counterpart Tim Jackson from Richard Taunton Sixth Form College in Southampton – as well as former Mystery Jets bassist Jack.
