- 1. There are still far too many people within the borough who are still unaware of the plans and the consultation process, possibly because of the choice of media outlets used to advertise the activity;
- 2. The Chairman of the Economic Development Board, Mr Philpott, made clear in June 2017 that he wanted "Anyone and everyone to have their say" and the current process has, in my opinion, fallen woefully short of this;
- 3. The teenagers of the borough have not, in my opinion, been engaged in the process to enable them to have their views heard; have there been roadshows at the borough's senior schools and colleges? These are the adults of tomorrow and they'll be living with the consequences of the legacy that we leave them;
- 4. This is an important crossroad for Gosport to dramatically reenergise the town, a stepping stone towards a bright future, or to let it drift even further towards obscurity. We've seen some planning decisions in the past that although well meaning at the time have not turned out to be so good in the long run, the Bus Station and the Town Hall structures are good examples.
